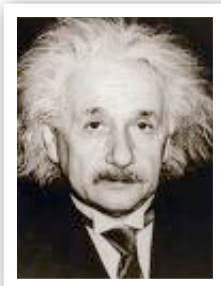


The Adventures of Everyday Geniuses

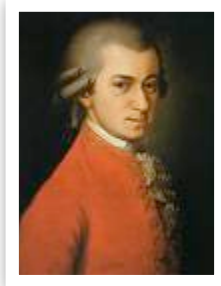
Albert Einstein

He couldn't talk until he was four, and he didn't learn to read or write until he was nine.



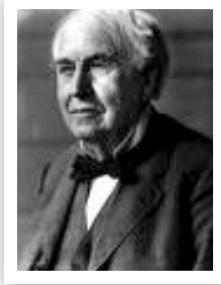
Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart
